WSLL Spring 2024 Registration FAQ

- **How can parents volunteer to manage or coach a team?**
 - Online Registration – Parents can register to manager or coach a team through the same system they use to register players.
- **Can I request a specific teammate/coach for my child?**
 - Requests can be made for players at the 5T, T-Ball, and 1A levels using the Special Request/Comments field during online registration.
 - Please note that we can not guarantee that all requests will be fulfilled.
 - AA, AAA, and Majors teams are formed by a player draft. As such, requests for specific teammates/coaches can not be considered.
- **Can players select their uniform number?**
 - ONLY Majors and IM players can select the number on the back of their uniform jersey during registration.
- **Will players be provided custom-sized jerseys?**
 - Yes, players at all levels will select their jersey size during online registration
- **Will players be provided uniform pants?**
 - Players at the 5T – 1A level will be provided pants.
 - **Players at AA and above will not be provided pants.**
- **What color of pants are required?**
 - AAA and below are required to wear white pants
 - Majors and IM are required to wear gray pants.
- **Do you automatically assign players to the same team as last spring?**
 - Only returning Majors players will be assigned to the same teams from the previous spring.
- **Will WSLI offer Intermediate (50/70) baseball for players who are League Age 13 (DOB: 9/1/10-8/31/11)?**
 - WSLI plans to field Intermediate teams in Spring 2024.
 - Players who are League Age 13 will be eligible for the Intermediate Division in Spring 2024

Spring 2024 Registration Rates – Early Registration

- *\$25 discount for second child and beyond in same family
- We are offering an Early Bird discount of \$25 per player between 11/1/23 through 12/3/23
- Late registrations between 1/8/24 to 1/14/24 will incur a \$25 late fee.
- Registration rates includes cost of player uniform and shared team equipment (e.g., bats, helmets, catcher's equipment, etc.)
- Players are responsible for providing their own baseball glove, cleats, protective cup, etc.

WSLL Refund Policy

Upon written request submitted to the President or Treasurer received before January 31 (on or before March 1 for 1A and below), the League will refund 100% of amounts paid. Upon written request submitted to the President or Treasurer before the last day of tryouts, the League will refund 50% of the registration fee and 100% of any volunteer fee paid. No refund will be given after tryouts conclude except for military move or serious injury. No refunds will be provided based on the denial of an age waiver for any reason. A \$10 handling charge for all refunds will be assessed. A \$15 returned check fee will be charged for all returned checks (not sufficient funds/closed account.)

Scholarships Available

No child will be turned away due to an inability to pay, regardless of ability. If you wish to apply for a league scholarship, please contact WSLL Scholarship, Kelly El-Yacoubi at kellyelyac@gmail.com

- No child will be turned away for inability to pay, regardless of ability. If you wish to apply for a league scholarship, contact [Kelly el-Yacoubi](#) or fill out an [online application](#).

Scholarship decisions are typically communicated in less than 7 days. If applying for a scholarship, please select "pay by check" at check out.

- Please note that scholarships do not cover the \$200 volunteer fee, which is fully refundable. This can be paid via a check that will not be cashed, as long as you meet the volunteer requirements. You can also pay by card, and the charge will be refunded once requirements are met.

Why do you charge a \$200 Volunteer Fee

Why does WSLL charge a volunteer fee?

- To successfully run a spring baseball season requires hundreds of hours of volunteer effort above what can be performed by the WSLL BOD
- Accordingly, WSLL charges a refundable volunteer fee to each family (excluding families with players only registered at the 5T and T-ball levels) in order to incentivize families to perform that work or to use the funds to contract out such work
- The volunteer fee also helps WSLL avoid time consuming fund-raising endeavors that can be frustrating for both players and parents.

How can families pay the volunteer fee, and how is it refunded if volunteer work is performed?

- Online Registration: If paying by credit card, the \$200 volunteer fee must be pre-paid when registering online. The full \$200 will be refunded later if your volunteer work requirements are met.

How can parents earn back their volunteer fee?

- Working one (1) four-hour shift on any of the dates during any of the preseason field preparation dates.
- Working two (2) 3-hour shifts in the Snack Bar/Concession Stand, two (2) tryout sessions (as available), two (2) league equipment pick up/turn-in sessions, or any combination of two (2) shifts of these activities.
- Attending umpire training and umpiring five (5) games at the 1A level or above.
- Serving as a League photographer and submitting photos that meet the requirements specified by the WSLL Yearbook chairperson.
- Serving as a Team Manager at the 1A level or above, plus two (2) sessions assisting WSLL Board Members while they perform Gray Hat duties.
- Volunteering for special events (e.g., Byronfest)
- Special Projects in Facility Improvement as approved by Volunteer Coordinator and League President.
- **NEW: WSLL is introducing a new volunteer fee option. Families have the option to select the “Volunteer Fee” to indicate they intend to earn back that fee, or they may choose the “Buyout” option to indicate they pay the \$200 volunteer fee and will not earn it back. If a family chooses the “Volunteer Fee”, it will be reimbursed at the end of the month in which the obligation has been met. However, if the obligation is not met, the \$200 Volunteer fee is forfeited to WSLL.**

Online Registration

- All players (new and returning) should register online
- Registration Dates:
 - Early Registration(-\$25/player): 11/1/2023 – 12/3/23
 - Open Registration: 12/4/23 - 1/7/24
 - Late Registration (+\$25/player): 1/8/24 - 1/14/24
 - No Registrations will be accepted after 1/15/24

3. Log in to your Sports Connect account


- Log in with your email and password
- Click 'Reset Password' if you forgot your password
- Click 'Create an Account' only if your family is new to WSL and does not already have an account

4. Click on Account Settings to update player/family information

- Add/update Emergency Contact info (required)
- Click on child's name to add/update child's Medical Info (required) and other information (e.g., home address, player's school, current grade, etc.)
- Click on Add Adult to add other parents/relatives to your account

4. Complete Registrations

- Follow the online registration process for players and adult volunteers (e.g., managers/coaches/team parents)
- Complete payment process as instructed



Online Registration - WSSL Boundary Map

- Verify WSSL eligibility - enter home or school address at <http://www.littleleague.org/LeagueFinder.htm>
- Your registration will be 'flagged' if the system does not recognize your address to be within the WSSL residential boundaries
- You will be allowed to complete registration, but may be asked for additional documents to prove eligibility to play in WSSL (e.g., proof of school enrollment within WSSL boundaries)
 - For returning WSSL Fall players, documentation may already be on file.



Documentation required to register with WSSL

Little League International requires WSSL to comply with the following proof of age (POA) and proof of residency (POR) policies in order to operate as an official Little League.

Families have to provide POA documentation only once during each player's time with WSSL. Families have to provide POR documentation only once for all players living at the same residence as long as the address remains the same.

Players will not be assigned to a team until all POA and POR documentation has been verified. Once refund deadlines have been reached, no refunds will be issued due to failure to provide POA or POR documentation.

WSSL is not responsible for the misplacement, loss or theft of any registration-required documents or the information they contain.

Age Verification

- Parents must present proof of age (POA) documentation (e.g. birth certificate or passport) for each player in order to complete the online registration. If you are in the process of obtaining a POA document of a player, please contact the Registrar for further instructions.

Documentation required to register with WSLL

Residence Verification

- If a player's residence is within [WSLL boundaries](#), the parent must provide 3 proofs or residency (POR) documents - one of each group described in next slide.
- If a player's residence is outside of WSLL boundaries, but the player's school is within the WSLL boundaries, the parent must submit a School Enrollment Form (SEF) which may be obtained by contacting the Registrar or Player Agent. Families living within the WSLL boundaries must not submit a SEF.
- WSLL encourages parents to submit any required proof of residency documentation by uploading images during the registration process. According to Sports Connect (SC), once verified by WSLL, all documents uploaded to (SC) are deleted after 6 months.
- If you cannot upload POR documents onto Sports Connect, WSLL will provide a limited number of opportunities to present the documents in person or by other remote means.
- For all POR documentation submitted, the parent's name, address, and document date must be clearly visible for the document to be valid. You may block or black out any other personal or sensitive information.
- For any questions about POA or POR documentation, please contact the Player Agent (marco.flores@wsllbaseball.net).

Documentation required to register with WSLL

Provide 3 total documents, one from each group below, **ONLY** if the players residence is within WSLL boundaries.

If the players residence is **OUTSIDE** WSLL boundaries, but the school they attend is within WSLL boundaries, please provide **ONLY** the School Enrollment Form (SEF).

RESIDENCY SHALL BE ESTABLISHED AND SUPPORTED BY:

- The table below may be helpful in assisting you in registering your player
- League Age for the 2024 Spring Season will be based on a player's age as of 8/31/24
- Please see Draft Process on Slide 15 for AA/AAA/Majors Team Formation information

- Permitted only with WSL approved Age Waiver. Waiver decisions based on tryout evaluation and available roster spots.
- Permitted in special circumstances (e.g., first time player, developmental limitations, etc.).

WSLL Playing Level Descriptions (5T-Majors)

1) 5-T

- Introduction to baseball concepts and skills for 5 year olds.
- Teams meet weekly on Saturdays for 90 minutes. The weekly meetings will consist of two parts, a practice session and a game.

2) T-Ball

- For young players who require some training in basic baseball concepts and skills

3) 1A (Machine Pitch)

- Player can catch most balls thrown to them overhand from 40'.
- Throw accurately to a 40' target.
- Hit the ball regularly in T-Ball, and at least occasionally, out of the infield.
- Catch fly balls with glove fingers facing up.

4) AA (Player Pitch)

- Catch 75% of the balls thrown to them overhand from 50'.
- Throw accurately to a 50' target
- Hit the ball regularly at the 1A level, and at least occasionally out of the infield.
- Catch fly balls routinely with glove fingers facing up and throw with good form.

5) AAA (Player Pitch)

- Catch, with ease, almost every ball thrown from 60 feet.
- Throw a ball with good mechanics accurately to a receiver 60' away.
- Hit the ball regularly with some authority, and, at least occasionally, out of the infield at the AA level.
- Routinely catch fly balls in a proper fielding position.

6) Majors (Player Pitch)

- Meet all of the qualifications of AAA players (as described below).
- Have had some success in AAA; or, if they never played in AAA, demonstrate through tryouts or their play at other levels or leagues that they could have.

***Note: Playing level may change after initial registration as a result of player assessments, age waiver decisions, and/or the results of the Majors and AAA drafts*

Intermediate (50/70) FAQ

Depending on interest and enrollment, WSSL will field Intermediate teams for the Spring 2024 season

1. Who can play Intermediate?

- Intermediate in the spring is open to players who will be League Age 13 (i.e., DOB between 9/1/10 and 8/31/11)

2. How is Intermediate different than Majors

- The pitching mound is set at 50' (versus 46' for Majors and below) and the bases are set at 70' (versus 60' at Majors and below). Thus, Intermediate is often referred to as '50/70 baseball.'
- Some rules are also different; specifically, those related to base running and stealing.

3. Why is WSSL having an Intermediate division?

- Many 13-year-olds want to continue to play baseball but are not yet ready to play on the full size (90') field that is used in Babe Ruth Baseball or travel team baseball.
- WSSL's goal is to have an opportunity for these kids to continue to play baseball and develop on a field that is best suited to their age, size, and skill level.

4. Will Intermediate players need to tryout?

- We do not anticipate that Intermediate players will need to attend a tryout/assessment.

5. Who will the WSSL team play against?

- The WSSL Intermediate teams will primarily play Intermediate teams from other local Little Leagues. As such, some local travel may be required for games.

6. Can WSSL fields be used for Intermediate games?

- Currently, Fenway (at Burke School) is the only WSSL field that is adaptable to 50/70 dimensions.

7. Will WSSL field an Intermediate All-Star team?

- We will field a team in the Virginia District 9 Intermediate All Star tournament.

8. What are the costs/fees to play Intermediate?

- The fees are the same as for 1A-Majors (\$175 registration fee + \$200 refundable volunteer fee). Sibling discounts will also be applied.
- Prices will increase by \$25 once early bird registration ends
- Like Majors, players will not be provided their own game pants.

WSLL Age Waiver FAQ

- 1. Who needs an age waiver?**
 - League Age 6 players applying for 1A
 - League Age 7 players applying for AA
- 2. How do I apply for an age waiver?**
 - Register for a level base on player's current age.
 - Email the Player Agent, Marco Flores (marco.flores@wsllbaseball.net) to request a waiver.
- 3. Do players requiring an age waiver need to tryout?**
 - Yes, all players meeting the criteria above must attend a tryout on 2/3/24
 - Tryout times and location will be emailed out and posted on www.wsllbaseball.net in mid/late January
- 4. Is the tryout the only factor used in approving/disapproving the waiver request?**
 - No. Approval of the waiver (by the WSLL Player Agent and Executive Committee) is based on the tryout AND the availability of open roster slots at the higher playing level after all age-appropriate players have been placed
- 5. What happens if the age waiver is approved?**
 - League Age 6 players with approved age waivers will be placed on a 1A team
 - League Age 7 players with approved age waivers will be drafted by a AA team
- 6. What else should I know?**
 - If the waiver is approved, your child may play with other children that could be up to 3 years older than him/her
 - If the waiver is approved, your child may play in weekday games that may run past 9pm
 - No refunds will be provided based on the denial of an age waiver for any reason
 - If your player registers to play during the fall 2024 season, he/she must register at the same level played during the spring 2024 season.

Uniform Specs and Sizing

- Below are the sizing charts for uniforms. Please select the appropriate size when registering your player
- **IM, Majors, AAA and AA players are responsible for providing their own pants.** AA and AAA players must wear white baseball pants. Majors and IM players must wear gray baseball pants.
- Please ensure you make uniform selections when you register so we can place our order to guarantee delivery in time for the start of the season
- The size chart below is a generic size chart issued by the manufacturer and is used for many different styles.
- The Average Age is meant only as a basic recommendation. We recommend you measure your players before you complete the registration.

Tryout Process

It is the responsibility of the parents to ensure their player(s) attend tryouts. Please arrive 15 minutes ahead of your child's scheduled time. Any player requesting an age waiver and does not attend tryouts will result in an automatic denial of the age waiver request

• Overview

- Every registered child will be assigned to a team. Tryouts are held to evenly distribute playing talent and assign players to the proper level of play
- Tryouts will be held on **Saturday 2/3/2024** (Majors, Age Waivers, select AA players) and **Saturday 2/10/23 (AAA)**
- Individual tryout times will be posted on www.wsllbaseball.net in mid/late January

• Who needs to tryout?

- **5T and T-Ball:** No tryouts required
- **1A:** Only League Age 6 players seeking an age waiver
- **AA:** Only players new to WSL, League Age 7 players seeking an age waiver, & children of AA Managers & pre-selected Coaches of Record.
- **AAA:** ALL players (including manager's sons/daughters).
- **Majors:** Non-Returning Majors Players who are interested in playing at the Majors level in the spring.
- **Intermediate:** We do not anticipate that Intermediate players will need to attend a tryout/assessment.

• Tryout Process

- Approximately 30 minutes total, including warm up time
- About 10 to 15 coaches and WSL BOD members will observe the tryouts
- Each player will be given 3 pitches to hit and will field 3 ground balls and 3 fly balls thrown by a coach
- Pitching tryout is optional

• What Happens Next?

- Approximately two weeks after tryouts, the annual drafts for the Majors, AAA, and AA playing levels will be conducted. Some players who tried out for Majors (or AAA) may go undrafted and will then be automatically entered in the AAA (or AA) draft.
- Players will be notified of their team assignment 1-2 days post draft

Draft Process – Team Formation for AA/AAA/Majors

Majors Draft

- First draft; typically held in late February.
- Majors teams that have returning players, reducing the overall draft slots for new Majors registrants
- Typically, WSLI has more Majors registrants than open Majors rosters slots available. As such, some players who registered for Majors may go undrafted and will be added to the AAA draft pool.
- All league age 12 players will be registered to the Majors level and must be drafted to a Majors team, unless a special age waiver to play in AAA is requested by the parent and approved by the District Administrator

AAA Draft

- Second draft; typically held in late February.
- Typically, WSLI has more AAA registrants than AAA rosters slots available. As such, some players who registered for AAA may go undrafted and will be added to AA draft pool
- Players who played AAA in the prior WSLI Spring season and players who are League Age 11 must be drafted into AAA and are not eligible to drop to the AA draft pool.

AA Draft

- Final draft; typically held the last week of February.
- All players are selected to AA teams. No players will drop to 1A.

Spring 2024 – Season Timeline (Tentative)

- After final registration is complete in January, here is what happens next...

1. Manager Recruitment and Selection *When: Early January*

- Manager candidates for Majors will interview with a selection committee
- WSLL will contact all parents who volunteered to manage a team to confirm their interest and intent
- If additional managers are needed, WSLL will solicit parents of players registered at those levels still in need

2. Player Tryouts

- *When:*
 - **2/3/24 (Majors, Age Waivers, Select AA)**
 - **2/10/24 (AAA)**
- Tryout dates/time/locations details will be emailed to families and posted at www.wsllbaseball.net when finalized
- See ‘Tryout Process’ info on **slide 18** for additional information re: who needs to attend the tryouts

3. Team Formation

- *When: Early/Mid Feb*
- 5T/T-Ball/1A
 - Teams are formed by a combination of player/coach requests and schools/neighborhoods grouping
 - Requests for specific teammates/coaches will be considered but not guaranteed
- AA/AAA/Majors
 - Teams formed by manager draft
 - No requests for teammates/coaches considered
- Shortly after your player has been assigned to/drafted by a team, you will be notified by his/her manager and/or via Sports Connect notification

4. Practices Start: Early March

5. Games Start: Early April (after FCPS Spring Break)

Please note that all time frames are general/tentative and dependent on weather, field conditions, etc.

Conditions of Registration

- **Behavior.** I understand that failure by either a parent or player to abide by Little League, WSLI, or team rules is grounds for suspension, and *removal of the player* from the league. Grounds for such actions include: persistent, unexcused absences from practices; verbal and physical abuse of parents, coaches, managers, umpires or league officials; misuse of league grounds and equipment; violations of public law; and any other behavior that undermines the league's effort to conduct itself according to the rules of Little League Baseball.
- **Disputes.** I understand that the team must try to satisfy up to 12 different families, within the restraints imposed by the Rules of Little League Baseball and WSLI. Thus, if I cannot volunteer to be a manager or coach, I will do my best to support the manager. If I have a serious disagreement with the manager, I will seek an appointment with him or her away from a game setting to discuss my concern. I understand that, if the dispute cannot be resolved, I may contact the League Director, who is my manager's supervisor. League Director email addresses can be accessed through the web site. I also may contact the Vice President for Baseball Operations, who supervises the League Directors, or the President any time I have a concern or question that cannot be resolved at the team level.
- **Umpires.** I understand that if I do not volunteer to umpire, and if no one on my team volunteers to umpire, there may be no umpires for my child's games. WSLI has multiple training opportunities for new and returning umpires. The league does not assign umpires to 5T, T-Ball, and 1A games. While WSLI endeavors to attract and assign at least one umpire to AA, AAA, and Majors games, our experience indicates that on average volunteers will cover only 75% of the games (less at lower levels, more at higher levels).

Conditions of Registration continued

- **Rainouts.** Unless otherwise notified by their manager or the league, players must come to the game field. On weekdays, the league attempts to make a decision regarding the status of scheduled games by 3pm, then will communicate that information via email or website posting. On weekends, when the weather is so bad that there clearly will be wholesale cancellations, WSLI endeavors to communicate cancellations as soon as they are known.
